I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and these events involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death. ("Harm")

I AGREE to hold harmless and release the TIEC from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the TIEC.

I **AGREE** to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the TIEC.

I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the TIEC and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse while at any event. I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without prejudice or penalty, and I acknowledge that I am strongly encouraged to do so while WARNING that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries. # FACILITY RULES AND REGULATIONS

**ENTRIES:** Entries must be postmarked or time-stamped by November 6, 2019 in order to avoid a late fee. Faxed entries will not be accepted.

### **CLOSING DATES for entries is November 6, 2019.**

The entry form for each horse must include the following:

- · Horse name and complete description
- · Complete mailing addresses for owner/trainer/riders
- · All mandatory signatures, including legal guardian in the case of a minor exhibitor
- Social Security or Federal ID number of owner or alternate prize money payee. No prize money will be applied until Tax ID#s and complete payee names/addresses/W-9's are on file with the Secretary. Prize money will be credited to your show account. Any overages will be mailed within 30 days of the close of the competition. In the event of unauthorized redeeming of a check, Tryon Horse Shows, LLC will provide check copies to exhibitors and will be held harmless from the collection process.

**PROTECTIVE HEAD GEAR**: Protective headgear, properly secured, must be worn BY ALL RIDERS AT ALL TIMES WHEN MOUNTED, anywhere, anytime on the horse show grounds. Headgear for all riders must meet or exceed ASTM Standards: must carry the SEI tag; and be properly secured by a harness per USEF rules.

STALLS: Permanent 10x12 stalls of wood/metal construction and temporary 10x10 stall of canvas/metal construction with doors. Day stalls are available for \$35 per stall. To ensure stabling as well as your initial bedding/feed orders, please complete and submit the online stabling request at www.tryon.com (under the competitor's tab).

**STABLING:** Will be available starting at 2:00 pm Monday of the show week. Any and all requests for early arrival/late departure must be approved by the Stabling Manager. Early arrivals/late departures will incur a charge of \$40 per stall per day (or any portion thereof).

**LODGING**: Please contact our Lodging Department at 828-863-1015 to inquire about available onsite/offsite lodging options, reserve a room, cabin or camper/RV site or golf cart. All reservations and payment for all reservations must be made directly to the Lodging Department. Campers/RV's/cabins, etc. may NOT be put on show bills, nor split on Trainer Accounts.

MINORS/MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parent(s) or guardian(s) of minors/ minor exhibitors shall hold the Horse Show Management and the Facility harmless for any injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted or number issued unless entry is signed by a parent or LEGAL guardian. The signature of unrelated persons WILL NOT be accepted. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from

that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**PARKING:** Fire regulations prohibit all vehicles, including trailers, vans and passenger vehicles from being parked in the stable areas. Vans and trailers will be allowed in the stable area only to load or offload. **PARKING AREAS WILL BE DESIGNATED AND VIOLATORS WILL BE TOWED AWAY AT OWNER'S EXPENSE.** 

**ELECTRICAL/FIRE REGULATIONS:** All electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles will be maintained clear for a minimum of six (6) feet wide by eight (8) feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class 1 Flammable liquids such as gasoline are allowed insde the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within the stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse.

**MOTORIZED VEHICLES/GOLF CARTS:** Under North Carolina State Laws and USEF rules, unlicensed drivers are not permitted to operate any motorized vehicles - ATV's, motorcycles, golf carts, etc., on the show grounds. Failure to abide by these regulations will subject the exhibitor to suspension from the horse show. See USEF GR 1301.7.

**LIABILITY:** Tryon Horse Shows, LLC, Tryon International Equestrian Center, Equestrian Sports Productions, their officials, and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectators, guest, rider, groom, attendant, other employees, animals, or equipment at the events. # ABOUT THE FIELD HUNTER



Foxhunting is the sport of mounted riders chasing wild quarry with a pack of hounds. It is the union of humans and animals in the beauty of nature's setting.

Mounted foxhunting has been an integral part of rural life in the United States for centuries. Fox hunting in North America began as early as 1650. Much of what is recorded about early hunting comes from the diaries of George

Washington, who was an ardent foxhunter and had his own pack of hounds.

Foxhunting continues to thrive today with some 160 clubs across the US and Canada has evolved and today the emphasis is placed on the chase and not the kill.



Over the centuries, the sport Foxhunting flourishes entirely because of the goodwill of landowners and farmers. Riders are constantly aware that they are guests on someone else's land and strive to do nothing to jeopardize this goodwill.

Tradition governs every aspect of the sport. From the attire worn by the rider to the turnout of the horse, each piece of clothing or saddlery has special significance.

Fox hounds are scent hounds and "speak" when they pick up the scent of the game, typically coyote, fox and bobcat in the south. The thrill of galloping across the countryside following a pack of hounds in "full cry," is breathtaking to all who partake.

The most important quality of a suitable hunting horse is safety. The horse should go quietly in a group, stop without a fight, stand patiently at checks (where hounds have lost the scent and go looking for it, with the huntsman helping them along), wait their turn at jumps, and jump without refusal.

Horses should always present at the hunt (meet) clean, neatly trimmed and properly tacked up. One of the more gratifying aspects of participating in this sport is the time invested in making sure you

and your mount are well "put together." These attributes will be judged today.

Today will begin with the hounds and huntsman on a run. After this will be a "mock hunt" where the huntsman will pretend to follow the hounds on a normal day. This will start as hounds in full cry, with the riders galloping behind.

You will likely hear different sounds of the horn. Different calls tell both hounds and the riders what's going on and where the pack is located.

Our judges will be looking for the field hunter they find most desirable for themselves to ride in the field, noting all the characteristics mentioned above.



# **COMPETITION RULES**

### The following definitions shall apply:

HUNT QUALIFIED means a horse/rider combination. Must have hunted three times with their hunt and the MFH or Secretary must sign the entry form.

1. All FOH hunt qualified horse/rider nominations (i.e. Championship class and Carolinas Foxhunter Series) must be submitted over the signature of either the Master or Secretary of the Hunt on the entry form.

2. Nominations and individual entries MUST be submitted by US Mail.

3. Open Class entries are not required to be hunt qualified.

4. TIEC Field Hunter/hilltopper championships competitors must hunt on one day of the two offered days so they can be judged in the field. Thursday's hunt is with Green Creek Hounds, please contact Donald Jefferis at djrugby@yahoo.com. Friday's hunt is with Tryon Hounds, please contact Carolyn Cadier at cccadier@gmail.com. It is the responsibility of each competitor to contact the hunts. The tentative start time will be 9am.

5. Hunt Teams must be composed of three riders from the same Hunt.

6. The Open competitions shall be by section: Maiden, Junior and Adult

7. Formal attire is required for TIEC Field Hunter and Hilltopper Championships and Hunt Teams. Ratcatcher or formal attire is appropriate for the Carolinas performance hunter/hilltopper and open classes

8. FOH Prize Money distribution:

Field Hunter \$4,000 total prize money
\$1,000 to the winner's hunt club
\$1,800-1st, \$900-2nd, \$300-3rd

Hilltopper \$1,000 total prize money \$500 to the winner's hunt club \$300-1st, \$150-2nd, \$50-3rd

Social Security or Federal ID number with a completed W-9 of owner or alternate prize money payee must be on file with the Competition Secretary. No prize money will be paid unless the forms are completed. Prize money will be paid within 30 days of the close of the FOH.

9. Prize money \$250.00 in Maiden Handy Hunter, Junior Handy Hunter and Adult Handy Hunter.

\$110.00 - 1<sup>st</sup>

\$80.00 - 2<sup>nd</sup>

\$60.00 - 3rd

10. Hospitality will be complimentary for all paid entries in the FOH. Additional tickets will be available for purchase at the door.

11. The Carolinas Foxhunter Series (CFS) is offered at four Carolinas based hunter trials. Year end awards are based upon points accumulated during the year by the same rider/horse combination in the four CFS events. The year end awards are presented at the Carolina Hound Show each year. The High Point Performance Hunter and Hilltop Hunter will each receive a \$500.00 prize.

Carolinas Performance Hunter - Jumps are no more than 3'0", participants may be asked to trot or canter fences, open and close gates, dismount and remount, or other fox hunting tasks.

Carolinas Hilltopper Hunter - Without jumps, participants could be asked to open and close gates, mount and dismount, reverse field, downward and upward transitions.

12. Maiden Hunter - open to prospective foxhunters and/or horses in their first season hunting - jumps 2'6" to 3'.

13. Junior Hunter - open to riders 17 years old and under - jumps 2'6" to 3'.

14. Adult Hunter - open to riders 18 years and over - jumps 2'6" to 3'.

15. Under Saddle classes - to be judged at walk, trot and canter. May be asked to hand gallop and/or halt at judges discretion.

16. The Competition Committee reserves the right to split, cancel or combine classes. A minimum of three entries is required per class.

17. Horses and ponies to be judged on manners, way of going, evenness of pace, and style of jumping. Conformation will not be a factor. Hunting soundness is required. Entrants will be excused after three refusals or an unintentional dismount. Unruly mounts may be excused at the discretion of the judge(s).

18. FOH Championship to be awarded to the Hunt accumulating the most points by Hunt qualified riders in the following classes: Field Hunter, Hilltopper, Under Saddle, all sections of Under Saddle, Handy and Hunt teams.

Points awarded: 1st - 5, 2nd - 3, 3rd - 2, 4th - 1
