Dressage - Freestyle 101

Saturday 3:00 pm – First Floor of the Media Building

Learn the importance of music selection and chorography as you design your freestyle.

Eventing - Vet Box

Friday 4:00 pm - Eventing Cross-Country Vet Box

An educational workshop on Vet Box Procedures will be offered for competitors in both the Championships and Modified Championships divisions. During this workshop, competitors will be familiarized with vet box procedures, resources, and basic principles for pulling up and cooling out after cross country. Briefing will also cover post-cool down strategies to ensure horses (and riders!) are comfortable, sound, and feeling their best for the Jumping Test on the final day of competition.

Polocrosse - Polowrapping for Success

A workshop designed to show you all the tricks to wrapping a perfect polowrap on your horse's legs. We will be discussing technique, materials, structures that it protects and the ways to properly wrap with a polowrap.

Polocrosse - Cooling Out and Tricks to Nail the Turnback for the Horse

Did you know there are simple, minor things that you can do to nail the horse's turnback on the first try? We will discuss tricks and things anyone can do to make sure their horse sparkles during their turnback checks!

Ever thrown a polocrosse ball? No experience necessary! This session is perfect for those interested in Polocrosse, and attendees will get a chance to get their hands on some racquets.







DRESSAGE

The French term for "training" is the harmonious development of the horse and rider in both mind and body, making the horse supple in their movements, a joy to ride, and beautiful to watch. Every horse, regardless of type or intended use, can benefit from this training. Competitions begin at the walk-trot level and continue through nine levels to Grand Prix.

EVENTING

Known as the Equine Triathlon because it includes three phases: Dressage, Cross Country, and Stadium. Originally developed in the calvarias of Europe as a test of the ideal military charger, Eventing has now evolved into an exciting sport attracting interest from all levels of sports enthusiasts.

GAMES

A fun mounted sport that teaches basic natural aids, physical coordination, self-confidence, and teamwork skills. Created by His Royal Highness Prince Philip, Games are supposed to encourage enthusiasm, participation, and training in young riders without the need of expensive ponies. It also fosters sportsmanship and the proper care of mounts in new and young members.

HORSE MANAGEMENT

Teaches responsibility and independence, and encompasses all things in horse care: health, maintenance, nutrition, and handling. At every Pony Club competition, riders compete in both the riding portion of the competition, as well as Horse Management. Competitors are scored on their ability to care for their horses, including barn area setup, turnout for themselves and their horses,











and their equipment. **POLOCROSSE**

Developed in Australia in the 1930s, it has been played internationally with great enthusiasm. Like lacrosse on horseback, Polocrosse develops a sense of strong self-confidence in riding ability while improving hand-eye coordination. This sport requires practice of ball handling skills such as bouncing, pick up, throwing, and catching the ball in the net of the racket.

QUIZ

Promotes a deep understanding and familiarity with the material presented at each testing level. Essentially a "question and answer" competition. Quiz is a fundamental and creative learning tool where members learn horsemanship and good horse care. It provides them with opportunities to display and learn good sportsmanship, leadership, stewardship, and teamwork.

SHOW JUMPING

Focuses on the agility and attention of the horse and rider as they navigate brightly colored fences. The jumps vary in height and width and may include water in which the horse must leap over, but not touch. Each course is intended to demonstrate energy, training, and obedience. The goal of the horse and rider is to negotiate the course without errors or disobediences.

TETRATHLON

An exciting four-phase sport comprised of running, swimming, riding, and shooting. Competitors must show good riding abilities as well as general athletic abilities. The development of Tetrathlon in Pony Club was encouraged by the US Modern Pentathlon and Olympic committees as a way to develop multi-talented athletes.

WESTERN DRESSAGE

Western Dressage is a fairly new discipline. Western Dressage promotes balance, rhythm, and carriage while using the training techniques from both classical dressage and western horsemanship. Western Dressage is taught with an emphasis on good horse management, knowledge of western equitation, turnout, and tack.

BARN:

USEF Rules will be followed at all times.

All Health Documents and Coggins must be presented at Security Check Point upon arrival and will be presented at Horse Show Office for documentation.

All Equine Med sharps (used) are to be placed in the sharps containers provided at each barn in the aisle.

No Smoking in Barns. Any smoking must take place well outside the barn area.

No Spectators in Barns; competitors and authorized personnel only.

No Cooking in the Barn areas.

PARKING:

Driver's Licenses are required to operate any motor vehicle (golf cart, motorcycle, and vehicle) on property. If age is a question Driver's License will be asked to be produced for verification.


