HUNTER CHALLENGE CLASSIC

To show under a Hunt & Go Format. First portion of the course will consist of the Classic portion with fences including verticals and oxers. The second portion of the course will be the Hunt portion, which will be a handy format including rollbacks and a trot jump. Both phases will be scored with the highest combined score winning the class. Each entry must have been entered and shown in order to compete in the class. A minimum of 10 entries are required to fill the class. Fence heights offered at 2'6 & 3'.

- 2. Submit an entry with a stall fee added.
- 3. If the horse, rider, trainer, etc. does not have a USEF number, select "Can't Find Your Horse (Rider, Trainer, etc.)?" and manually enter the information.
- 4. If you are shipping your horse in for the weekend, add the "Ship In Fee" when entering.
- 5. Tack stalls can be ordered directly onto horses or onto the barn account (which is automatically created) and can be split when you check in for the show.

Cost

- 1. \$125 per Stall or Tack Stall.
- 2. This fee includes Equine Night Security.
- 3. A form of payment is required for a stall to be considered reserved.

Deadline

- 1. Stalls are non-refundable after the closing date of each show.
- 2. Stalls are limited and will be available on a first come first serve basis.

Cancellations

- 1. Stalls canceled after the closing date are non-refundable.
- 2. To cancel a stall/entry, please email lbennett@tryon.com and jnodine8@gmail.com (Stall fee and scratch fee may apply).

Shavings/Hay

- 1. Shavings and hay can be ordered on each entry or on the trainer's barn account, which is automatically created after the first horse is entered.
- 2. Shavings and hay can be split via trainer splits. Trainer splits are due by Noon on Friday.

Move-In

- 1. Stalls are available Tuesday at 1:00PM.
- 2. Early arrival fee will apply to anyone that arrives prior to the designated arrival time.

Required Health Documents

1. A negative Coggins test within one year must be presented with the horse(s) at the gate upon arrival.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, its decision to be final. Management reserves the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings and rotate judges; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s) or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause. While every effort has been made to avoid mistakes in this publication, Tryon Horse Shows, Tryon International Equestrian Center, and its management and/or employees assume no liability to anyone for errors. Any significant errors or changes will be disclosed to competitors whose entries are accepted upon their acceptance.

SCHEDULES: All Schedules are Tentative and subject to change. Updated schedules and daily schedules are available at www.tryon.com.

ENTRIES: Entries must be made online by the closing dates in order to avoid a late fee. Faxed, scanned and/or e-mailed entries will not be accepted.

CLOSING DATES for entries are as follows: TRYON WINTER PREMIER- JANUARY 9, 2023 TRYON WINTER ENCORE- JANUARY 16, 2023

After the closing date stall fees are non-refundable. A \$25 Late Fee will apply for all entries not made online or postmarked by the closing dates. Entries should be submitted via our online entry system at www.tryon.com or www.showgroundslive.com. EMAILED/SCANNED/FAXED ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. Back numbers will not be issued without a signed open check drawn on a US bank or credit card information logged with the Horse Show Secretary. A \$30 fee will be charged for non-negotiable checks or credit cards declined for any reason. A \$50 Office/EMT Fee will be charged to each horse to cover adds/scratches, office services, etc. All accounts must be closed out by Sunday of each show week unless prior arrangements have been made with the horse show secretary.

SCRATCHES: Horses may be scratched without a veterinarian's certificate by notifying the horse show secretary in writing. Prior to the closing date, all charges will

be refunded. After the closing date, stalls are non-refundable. No refunds to horses entered in classes not shown. We encourage you to close out your account each week in person or online. If you do not, you automatically agree to authorize Tryon Horse Shows to charge your credit card or open check for all entry fees, stabling fees, association fees, etc. associated with your horse(s). If you dispute a charge made by Tryon Horse Shows, you may not be able to show until the dispute has been resolved.

STALLS: All stalls are non-transferable and remain under the ownership and control of Tryon International Equestrian Center. Permanent 10x12 stalls of wood/metal construction and temporary 10x10 stall of canvas/metal construction with doors may be used. Flooring is rubber mats over stone dust. Stalls are available for \$125. Stalls are not refundable after the closing date. To ensure stabling as well as your initial bedding/feed orders, please complete an online entry at Tryon.com. Non-stabled horses will pay a \$35 Grounds Fee.

STABLING: Will be available starting at 1:00PM the day before Schooling Day. Any and all requests for early arrival/late departure must be approved by the Stabling Manager. Early arrivals/late departures will incur a charge of \$50 per stall per day (or any portion thereof).

PRIZE MONEY & REFUNDS: Social Security or Federal ID number of owner or alternate prize money recipient are required for prize money to be distributed. No prize money will be applied until Tax ID#s and complete payee names/addresses/W-9's are on file with the Secretary. Prize money will be credited to your show account once a tax ID/W9 is on file. Any overages (over payment or prize money remaining) will be mailed within 30 days of the close of the competition. In the event of unauthorized redeeming of a check, Tryon Horse Shows, LLC will provide check copies to exhibitors and will be held harmless from the collection process. Prize money will not be applied or distributed unless a w-9 with tax ID is on file.

PHOTO RELEASE: By signing the entry form I agree to waive the right to the use of my photos/videos at the competition and grant Tryon Horse Shows, LLC, and its agents full use of any and all competition photos and videos.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: Protective headgear, properly secured, must be worn BY ALL RIDERS AT ALL TIMES WHEN MOUNTED anywhere on the horse show grounds. Headgear for all riders must meet or exceed ASTM Standards.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: All non-showing horses must have a signed entry blank on file in the office and will be assigned a number. A \$25 Non-Showing Fee will be assessed to any horse not entered in any classes.

TRAINER SPLITS: Trainer Splits are done as a courtesy and must be turned into the Horse Show Office by 12:00 Noon on Friday. Any trainer accounts which have not been split will be evenly split on all horses entered into the horse show.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

MINORS/MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parent(s) or guardian(s) of minors/minor exhibitors shall hold the Horse Show Management and the Facility harmless for any injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted or number issued unless the entry is signed by a parent or LEGAL quardian. The signature of unrelated persons WILL NOT be accepted. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian, or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to seqways, hoverboards and single wheeled scooters are prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

COURSES: Management reserves the right to restrict the area of the courtesy circle by a mandatory line.

DOGS: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash or otherwise contained at all times. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Failure to maintain your dog under control, as defined here, will result in a \$100 fine assessed to the owner. In addition, pursuant to facility regulations, loose dogs will be removed from the show grounds by Animal Control, at the owner's expense and impounded.

PARKING: Fire regulations prohibit all vehicles, including trailers, vans and passenger vehicles from being parked in the stable areas. Vans and trailers will be allowed in the stable area only to load or off-load. PARKING AREAS WILL BE DESIGNATED AND VIOLATORS WILL BE TOWED AWAY AT OWNER'S EXPENSE.

ANIMAL WELFARE: We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and should never be

subject to mistreatment. Owners, trainers, riders, and grooms or their agents must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose. At all times, while the horse is on the show grounds, we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse. No poling, use of bamboo off-set or excessive use of the whip will be tolerated. The well-being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials. IN THE EVENT OF AN ACUTE AND SERIOUS INJURY TO OR ILLNESS OF A HORSE ON COMPETITION GROUNDS WHEN THE OWNER OR TRAINER OF THE HORSE OR AGENT OF THE OWNER IS NOT PRESENT, AFTER REASONABLE EFFORT TO CONTACT THAT INDIVIDUAL HAS BEEN MADE, COMPETITION MANAGEMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH A LICENSED EQUINE VETERINARIAN, MAY AUTHORIZE THE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY VETERINARY TREATMENT OF THE HORSE. IF COMPETITION MANAGEMENT SO AUTHORIZES TREATMENT UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS RULE, COMPETITION MANAGEMENT AND VETERINARIAN ARE NOT LIABLE FOR ANY RESULTING COSTS, DAMAGES, LOSSES, CLAIM OR ACTIONS ARISING DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY FROM THE TREATMENT OF THE HORSE.

ELECTRICAL/FIRE REGULATIONS: All electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles will be maintained clear for a minimum of six (6) feet wide by eight (8) feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in the aisles. No Class 1 Flammable liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within the stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES/GOLF CARTS: Under North Carolina State Laws, unlicensed drivers are not permitted to operate any motorized vehicles on the show grounds. Failure to abide by these regulations will subject the exhibitor to suspension from the horse show.

LIABILITY: Tryon Horse Shows, LLC, Tryon International Equestrian Center, Equestrian Sports Productions, their officials, and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectators, guest, rider, groom, attendant, other employees, animals or equipment at the events. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, their horses or their dogs. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events, and to keep that policy up to date.

WARNING: UNDER NORTH CAROLINA LAWS, AN EQUINE ACTIVITY SPONSOR OR EQUINE PROFESSIONAL IS NOT LIABLE FOR AN INJURY TO, OR THE DEATH OF A PARTICIPANT IN EQUINE ACTIVITIES RESULTING EXCLUSIVELY FROM THE INHERENT RISKS OF EQUINE ACTIVITIES.
